

# SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

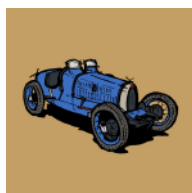
## vehicles

Please send a photo of the car you want us to draw to

Always try and include your name and your order number so that we can make sure we match the correct picture to the correct customer. Please also include the registration number in your email if you would like this on your illustration.

Your camera doesn't have to be great, most phones take good pictures these days that are up to the job. Don't worry about the car being clean! All we need from the photo is to see the shape clearly and get a colour reference.



It's best to stand quite far back to make sure you get the whole vehicle in the shot. Sometimes you might want the rear of the vehicle instead of the front, that is ok. Generally it's best to take a 'three-quarters' view - this means that part of the side and part of the front (or rear) is visible.

If you are not able to get a photograph, we can find and work from a stock photo of your vehicle and add your specified colour and registration number.

Please contact us where a vehicle has a custom paint-job or stickers that you want shown and we can talk about how best to approach it. Extra complexity is likely to affect the time required and price of such a commission.

## homes & small buildings

There are two ways to provide an image for us to use as the basis for your home illustration.

Firstly, you can send us a photo of the home you want us to draw. Your camera doesn't have to be great, most phones take good pictures these days that are up to the job. It's good to stand quite far back to make sure you get the whole building in the shot. Sometimes you might want the back of the house instead of the front, that is ok.

Alternatively you can send us a link using Google Streetview. Enter the address into [google.co.uk](http://google.co.uk) on the internet, select 'Maps' and then 'More', then 'Streetview'. Use the buttons to change the view until you have managed to locate your house. Once you are happy, select 'Print' to open up a new window - copy the full internet address link from the top bar of your browser and paste it into your email to us.

It is best to try to choose an angle from which the building is not substantially obscured e.g. by tall trees. If part of the home is obscured in the image you provide we will normally draw the thing obscuring it, rather than attempting to guess what lies behind.

Unless you specifically request them when you order we may choose not to include certain items in the illustration, such as street furniture; outbuildings not attached to the house (eg garages, sheds, greenhouses); tv aerials; satellite dishes; bins etc. That said, we are very happy to include them as they often add to the character of the house! Please let us know any preferences when you place your order.

For terraced and semi-detached homes we generally just show your half, with the lines that loosely suggest your immediate neighbours property running off the side of the image. For flats and apartments we generally show the whole front of the building. Take a look at our gallery to see some examples of terraces, semi-detached houses and flats/apartments.
